

School Calendar

Burnaby South is a linear school, where students are enrolled in 8 fulltime courses, beginning in September and ending in June, with 3 official reporting periods. Students attend 4 courses on one school day, with the second set of 4 courses on the next day.

Some students may choose to take additional "9th Courses" which can occur before or after school.

Grading System

The Burnaby School District does not rank students, but we do provide an unweighted GPA with the highest eligible of 4.0.

Our students are also graded using the following letter grade system:

A = 86 - 100% (4.0) - Excellent

B = 73 - 85% (3.0) - Very Good C+ = 67 - 72% (2.5) - Good

C = 60 - 66% (2.0) - Satisfactory

C- = 50 - 59% (1.5) - Min. Acceptable I = 0 - 49% (0.0) - Incomplete

F = 0 - 49% (0.0) - Failed

Mission Statement

School & Community

Burnaby South is a very large urban high school located in Burnaby, a suburb of Vancouver, British Columbia. We are best known for our AP Capstone Diploma, American Sign Language, and Michael J Fox Theatre. Burnaby South is the only school in BC with an indoor running track and TV Production Studio. We have a very strong emphasis on Community Involvement, Humanitarian & Environmental Issues.

Burnaby South enrolls the most diverse multicultural populations of all Burnaby schools, with our families coming from a wide range of socio-economic backgrounds. Our students are in Grades 8-12, with a current student population over 1590, and a graduating class of 453. Post-Graduation, approximately 60% of Burnaby South students enter a College/University Program directly from High School.

Covid-19 Update (September 2020 - Present)


During our 2020-21 school year, the Burnaby School District's primary objective was the safety and well-being of our students & staff. We limited access to schools for anyone but staff & students and eliminated school wide assemblies and gatherings. All staff & students wore masks in all common areas: hallways, cafeteria and outside learning groups. Parents performed daily self-health assessments with their children prior to arriving at school, schools had a staggered start, lunch & dismissal times, and we added enhanced cleaning and disinfecting protocols throughout the school day.

In September 2020, due to Covid-19, the Burnaby School District pivoted from a Linear, to a Quarter System to allow students to be in learning groups of 30 or fewer students. In this Quarter System, students attended 2 classes every day for 10-week quarters (for a total of eight classes over the year). Our senior students (Grade 10-12) attended one in-person morning class daily with a second afternoon class involving a mix of online and in-school learning. Microsoft Teams was used by all staff & students, to allow access to learning. This Quarter system was unfamiliar to all of our students, with our current Grade 12s experiencing increased stress. Due to Covid-19 health and safety guidelines for the 2020-21 school year, all in-person extra-curricular activities were cancelled (ie: Sport Teams, Science Fairs), our school also enrolled 200 fewer International Students due to travel restrictions.

With Covid-19 still impacting us this 2021-22 school year, the Burnaby School District pivoted again from last years Quarter system to a Semester System, where students are attending 4 classes every day in Semester 1, and 4 classes in Semester 2. We have planned for a "nearly normal" school year where students are able to fully participate in all aspects of school, including extracurricular clubs and teams. Safety continues to be our top priority, so students and staff are required to wear masks in all areas of our school and must complete a Daily Health Check prior to entering the building.

Academics

Burnaby South is committed to developing students who are confident, independent learners, with the ability to think critically, and act responsibly. Our focus is to educate students to participate actively as contributing citizens in a changing world. Our commitment is to provide a safe, supportive learning environment where individual potential is nourished and learners are challenged to reach for excellence.

Students at South have access to a wide range of learning experiences through our core subject areas (Math, Sciences, English, Social Studies & Physical Education), Business & Fine Arts courses, and Junior & Senior Leadership. For our English Language Learners, we diversify and tailor our instruction to meet the academic language needs of our students so they can demonstrate their maximum potential in English. We are the only school in British Columbia to offer the Cisco Networking Academy and the only school in Burnaby to offer a Fitness Trainer Certificate, and an interdisciplinary Math, Science, Engineering Program.

All Graduates in BC are required to complete & present a career focused graduation project which integrates personal interests & strengths with their preferred future possibilities. Students work with mentors to inform career-life development and exploration, where they reflect on their experiences in and out of school. Students also complete a minimum of 30hrs of work experience; although, some can complete 80hrs in a specific area, if the work experience & courses combine in a common career focus.

Pre-AP Honours & Advanced Placement

Burnaby South offers an Advanced Learning program which consists of 22 Pre-AP Honours courses offered to students in Grades 8-11 (intended to motivate and advance learners), and 22 Advanced Placement Courses.

This school year our 22 AP Courses include: 2-D & 3-D Design, Biology, Calculus AB & BC, Capstone Research & Seminar, Chemistry, Chinese Language, Computer Sci A & Principles, English Literature, French Language, Human Geography, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Music Theory, Physics 1, Physics 2, Psychology, Statistics & Studio Art: Drawing.

We are also only 1 of 36 schools in Canada who have been selected to offer the innovative AP Capstone Diploma Program. Students engage in the rigorous development of skills critical for post-secondary success in inquiry, research, collaboration, and writing.

Over the last 5 years, over 33% of Burnaby South students took 1 or more Honours/AP course, and over 38% of all Grade 12 students were enrolled in at least one AP course. Over the last few years, approx 70% of all AP exams written received a grade of 4 or 5, with 90% of all exams receiving a grade of 3, 4 or 5. We have also had students as young as Grade 9 write an AP exam and receive a score of 5 out of 5. Last school year, 224 students in Grade 9-12 signed up for an AP Course, with 225 AP Exams written in May. We had 61 AP Scholar Winners, 12 AP Scholar with Distinction, 3 AP Capstone Diploma Winners & 8 AP Capstone Certificate Winners.
