National Truth and Reconciliation Day

On September 30th, 2024, we acknowledged and commemorated the abuse, trauma and stolen lives that were taken away from Indigenous children in residential schools. Students wore orange to display their support the previous Friday, September 29th and raised awareness to show the devastating impact of residential schools. By wearing orange, we acknowledge the struggles of those affected and commit to listening, learning and fostering healing. Phyllis Webstad is the person who kickstarted the origin of Orange Shirt Day. She wrote "The Orange Shirt Story" in 2018 which is a children's book depicting real-life events. As a six year's old girl, she was stripped of her brand new orange shirt her grandmother had given to her. Despite begging and crying for it back, her pleas were ignored. We wear orange to give recognition to her, and other victims who suffered due to these residential schools.


