When is the deadline for scholarships?

• Applications generally start in February, some in November and December and go until April.

What scholarships does Burnaby South offer?

Info is posted outside of Kenny Kwan's office. Students must ask for applications and be recommended/approved by the school. Info is also posted on Kenny Kwan's website/blog and is sent through "teams" - applications can be picked up. Students divided alphabetically for who they see - Mr. Kwan or Miss Kuang. Students can apply to as many scholarships as they want - can get them from different sources but have to follow stipulations. If a student is approved for many they would have to pick and choose which ones to accept.

Question about marks for CLC - what are they/how are students marked?

• For CLC 11 and 12, students get 2 credits each, each course is one year long. Comments are given on progress, there are no marks throughout the year. At the end of the year a final mark is given and goes towards the student's GPA.

Question about the timeline of CLC 11 - what should students be doing after completing CLC 11 until June to prepare for CAPSTONE?

• Students finish CLC 11 by April and will then meet with Mr. Kwan or Miss Kuang to prepare for Gr.12 CAPSTONE. After students present their proposals they can change their plans in September if they change their minds over the summer.

Is it becoming more difficult for students to do their Grad Projects during COVID? Are students getting some slack for volunteer/work experience?

- Yes, it has been more difficult. The school has been sending info to Gr. 12's through "Teams" and a newsletter is posted every Wednesday.
